View 2: Spoken English does not have a special grammar: its grammar is just the same as the grammar of written English. Conversation makes use of entities such as prepositions, modals, noun phrases and relative clauses, just as written language does. So - assuming, as many would, that differences of frequency belong to the use of the grammar, rather than to the grammatical system itself - it is quite natural to think in terms of one English grammar, whose use in conversational performance ...

Finally, I want to remind you that spoken English does not perfectly follow grammar rules a lot of the time – especially sentence structure. The sentence structure of spoken English is often quite fluid; we speak in run-on sentences (that means sentences that are too long if we were to write them down) or sentence fragments, which would be too short in written English.
