Those teaching adults should understand and practice the five principles of *andragogy* espoused by Malcolm Knowles, a pioneer in the study of adult learning. Knowles posited that adults learn best under the following circumstances: The learning is self-directed. The learning is experiential and utilizes background knowledge.

The 5 Principles of Adult Learning Pioneered by Malcolm ...

Andragogy suggests that because adults are self-driven (*man-leading*) and are expected to take responsibility for decisions, learning programs or courses must support this notion. Building from this concept, Knowles structured the *Adult Learning Theory (Andragogy)* in 1968, which still stands as a pillar for creating adult learning materials.

Adult learners are often engaged in learning because a problem needs to be solved. Practicing skills in a controlled environment allows them to grow self-efficacy in new tasks that prepare them to act autonomously outside of the learning environment.

There are many different theories of adult learning, including: andragogy, neuroscience, experiential learning, self-directed learning, and transformational learning. 3 Adult Learning Theories Every E-Learning Designer Must Know

In 1984, Knowles suggested 4 principles that are applied to adult learning: Adults need to be involved in the planning and evaluation of their instruction. Experience (including mistakes) provides the basis for the learning activities. Adults are most interested in learning subjects that have immediate relevance and impact to their job or personal life. Adult learning is problem-centered rather than content-oriented.

Adult learners are motivated when they can see the benefit. Provide a collaborative, supportive experience that allows patients to check in on their progress. Whether this means comprehension questions or teach-back moments from a nurse, it's important to provide the learner with an opportunity to check their progress.

The Principles of Adult Learning Theory The "father" of adult learning theory was Malcolm Knowles (1913-1997). He called his theory andragogy (the design and delivery of instruction for adults), to distinguish it from pedagogy (the design and delivery of instruction for children and adolescents).

Summary: Andragogy refers to a theory of adult learning that details some of the ways in which adults learn differently than children. For example, adults tend to be more self-directed, internally motivated, and ready to learn. Teachers can draw on concepts of andragogy to increase the effectiveness of their adult education classes.
