Disruptive Behavior Disorders (DBD): Symptoms, Diagnosis ...

Disruptive behavior disorders and untreated ADHD have been found to lead to an increased risk of substance use disorders. In addition, adolescents with disruptive behaviors disorders and ADHD are more likely to be aggressive and hostile in their interactions with others, and to be arrested.

Disruptive Behavior Disorders - CHADD

Behavioral disorders involve a pattern of disruptive behaviors in children that last for at least 6 months and cause problems in school, at home and in social situations.Nearly everyone shows some of these behaviors at times, but behavior disorders are more serious. Children with a disruptive behavior disorder will show repeated and persistent patterns of anger, defiance, backtalk, trouble managing and regulating their emotions, and even hostile or aggressive behavior toward grownups or other children. The behavior is basically what you might see in a typical child, but more—more intense, more frequent, more ongoing, and more difficult to control.

Signs of Disruptive Behavior Disorder in Children

This chapter focusses on the historical and current approaches adopted in the American Psychiatric Association's Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders (DSM) to six mental health conditions: attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder, oppositional defiant disorder, conduct disorder, substance use disorder (alcoholism and drug addiction), antisocial personality disorder, and disruptive mood dysregulation disorder.

Disruptive, Impulse-Control, and Conduct Disorders. Disruptive, impulse-control, and conduct disorders involve much more critical and constant behaviors than typical, temporary episodes of most children and adolescents. They belong to a group of disorders that involve oppositional defiant disorder, intermittent explosive disorder, conduct disorder, antisocial personality disorder, pyromania, and kleptomania.
